

Steps Taken: Attempted to reset MFA using Microsoft 365 Admin Center and PowerShell. Verified admin permissions - global admin role is assigned. Confirmed that no conditional access ...

Reset MFA: Since you mentioned you are the only admin, you might need to reset your MFA settings. You can do this by going to the Azure portal and navigating to your user profile under ...

Set up a new authenticator app: Once your IT support has reset your MFA settings, you can install the Microsoft Authenticator app on your new phone and set it up again. Make sure to ...

If you are the administrator, then please go to entra admin portal>users>All users>(choose the user you want to reset MFA.) Authentication Methods>Require re-register multifactor ...
